What is the Beltrami County Shooting Sports Park?

A firearms education and training facility that will provide classrooms and range facilities to the public and shooting clubs that will offer firearms and law enforcement training, hunter education along with recreational and competitive shooting opportunities in a safe and controlled environment.

Why A Shooting Sports Park?

- To educate the public and promote the safe and responsible use of firearms.
- To provide area residents and visiting guests a family-friendly place to shoot that is monitored for safety and environmental impact.
- To create a Regional Law Enforcement Training Facility
- To pass on the rich traditions of hunting and the shooting sports
- ▶ For safety: Growth and development of this Bemidji area has eliminated many back-yard shooting ranges along with most of the gravel pit sites. This has created an environment where many people target practice in undesignated and potentially unsafe areas.

- Safety Officers will monitor all public shooting.
- Users will be required to participate in a safety orientation and view a safety video before using the ranges.
- The Shooting Park Perimeter will be fenced and signed.
- Ranges will be designed to current standards and practices that will include berming and covered firing points.

Are Hunting and the Shooting Sports Safe?

 Outdoor shooting sports are some of the safest forms of recreation in America, especially when compared with with other outdoor activities such as football, downhill skiing and horseback riding.

Who Will Operate and Maintain the Shooting Park?
